#### The Radish Seed Fund

The "Radish Seed Fund" is a peer-to-peer community loan fund. It was created through contributions from ordinary people. In May 2025, one individual/ household will receive \$1,000. Over the course of one year, they will pay back that loan with zero interest.

Once the loan has been repaid, the fund will open up again and a second individual/household will receive \$1,000. This money will continue circulating through our community over and over again, for as long as it is repaid. That means that one chunk of money can help a whole lot of people.

# **Diaconate Report**

The communion liturgy will be changed seasonally, with the current one used until Pentecost. The Good Friday service with Dodgeville UMC will be here at 6:00. Easter flowers will be ordered.

Mark, Jill, and Mary will go through the paraments and banners and decide which ones to keep, along with cleaning out other items in the storage room. Pastor Katya reached out to other

clergy re donating the old choir music. Also discussed were the Christmas costumes. Farmers' Appreciation Day parade was discussed, will use Mark's truck, Rod and Marilyn agreed to play music. Mark will obtain banners with the church name on them for the sides of the truck.

### **New Business:**

Request for financial contribution to Mineral Point UCC to support the Rewilding Series of lectures and services being offered there March 22-May 18 – Steve moved and Denise seconded to send them \$100. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 1 against, and 1 abstention.
