Several years ago, I knew a family that genuinely followed the rhythms of the church year in their daily lives. The father in the family had spent his career working in the church, and his wife was church member and volunteer extraor-



dinaire. One of their daughters became a pastor. The church really was their life.

I met this family after the father had retired from ministry, and both he and his wife had some chronic illnesses. A few years later, the husband passed away, on Saturday December 2<sup>nd</sup>. The next day was the first Sunday of Advent, the start of the church year. The family members noted how appropriate it was that he was starting his new journey into eternal life as we were beginning a new church year. Honoring the church year gave the family a sense of completion and comfort in their grief.



## What does it look like to tell the good news through the stories of women who are often on the margins of scripture and often set up to represent bad news? How would a lectionary centering women's stories, chosen with womanist and feminist commitments in mind, frame the presentation of the scriptures for proclamation and teaching?

The scriptures are androcentric, male-focused, as is the lectionary that is dependent upon them. As a result, many worshippers know only the biblical men's stories told in the Sunday lectionary read in their churches. A more expansive, more inclusive lectionary will remedy that by introducing readers and hearers of scripture to "women's stories" in the scriptures.
