



Lent: A Season of Repentance

The church year follows a rhythm. We begin in Advent, with God's promises

of sending something new into this imperfect world. Then, Jesus is born on Christmas! We celebrate for 12 days, until Epiphany. In the season after Epiphany, we recognize God's presence in the world in new ways, while also acknowledging that we do not always welcome or understand God's presence.

Then we come to Lent. This 6-week season is a time to reflect on our humanity, to recognize that we have not always welcomed God respectfully, and to repent from those actions that have kept us apart from God. At the end of Lent, we find Jesus on the cross, suffering as a result of the failure of humans to respond faithfully to God's call.

But death doesn't have the final word. After Lent, we celebrate new life on Easter! This season is about both the resurrection of Jesus,

and the renewed chance that humanity has to respond faithfully. Easter continues until the day of Pentecost, when we celebrate the presence of the Holy Spirit moving among all people. For the next several months, in the season after Pentecost (or "ordinary time"), we see the many ways that the Spirit is active among the ancient prophets, the ministry of Jesus, and our world today.

Right now, we are in the season of Lent. We are called to reflect on those things that separate us from God, and that we need to change moving forward in our lives of faith.

The Wisconsin Council of Churches created a resource for Lent this year called "Repenting from Christian Nationalism." Their website explains the need for this series:

"Christian Nationalism has been in the headlines, and we know many faith leaders have been wondering how to respond. We invite you to join with congregations exploring how this is more than a *them* problem - it's an *us* problem, too."

As we reflect on our relationship with God, barriers to that relationship, and where we can grow in faithfulness, it is important to remember that our lives of faith happen alongside the rest of our lives. Relationships, work, volunteering, and public engagement are all interconnected to our relationship with God.

We cannot separate our faith from our political viewpoints, our shopping habits, or the way we treat other people. There is constant temptation to turn some aspect of our life into an idol – something that is more important to us than God. Specifically, in this country at this point in history, many are being tempted to place love of country above love of God.

This Lent, we are invited to examine how we interact with the world around us, and remember that our relationship with God is more important than anything else. When we find ourselves prioritizing a person, hobby, occupation, or belief system more than we value God, our faithful response is to repent, to return to God, and to reprioritize our lives. Thank you for joining me in this Lenten journey.



Pastor's Report

In addition to prepping worship in advance, I spent time coordinating the event with Professor Nessan last Saturday, which I think went very well! It was helpful to be in community with folks from various churches, and to hear the perspective of an expert in the field.

Mary H is going to update the office hours to be 10am-2pm Tues and Thurs, and 8am-2pm Wed. She will also add hours on Sunday, 9:30-11:30am, as currently Google lists the church as closed on Sundays!

Committee Reports

Missions

The distributions for Joyful Noise (JN) collections are up to date or are in progress.

Financial

Steve submitted report of checking account balance. There was no report from Zander for January. Stewardship was up in January (some members making their contributions for the year). The gross receipts from pasty sales in January was around \$4000.

<u>Trustees</u>

Three things are on the Trustee plate right now.

- 1) Steve and I will be meeting with Dave Brick next week to discuss repairs to the two closets off the Fellowship Hall.
- 2) The Fire Marshall finally came to check our fire extinguishers. He removed all of ours and replaced them with certified extinguishers. He will now come annually. Mary Haag is to keep a record of these visits.
- 3) We have talked with the artist Lisa Humke about the possibility of designing a mural for the unused outside door on Main Street. She will submit ideas and a bid.
